

ADAIR COUNTY CASE COUNT RISES TO 3,763

Kirkville, MO 11/23/21 – The Adair County Health Department has confirmed six new cases of COVID-19 which brings the overall count to 3,763. There are currently 43 active cases and 3,685 people who have left isolation.

New cases involve females ages 1, 3, 25, 27 and 59 and a 45-year-old male. One case resides at an address with at least one other confirmed case.

In the seven-day period from Nov. 13-19, there were 38 new cases confirmed in Adair County. Cases among those ages 51-90 exceeded those ages 0-30, 41% to 34%. Among these cases, only five were in the K-12 schools sector and one was in the higher education sector.

The Adair County Health Department recommends that all county residents ages 5 and older get vaccinated against COVID-19 and the Delta variant. The Department hosts a walk-in vaccine clinic at the Health Department clinic, 1001 South Jamison Street, tomorrow, Nov. 24 from 2 p.m. until 4 p.m. The Pfizer pediatric dose will be administered to those ages 5-11.

Parents must schedule an appointment by calling the Health Department at 660-665-8491. You are encouraged to stop by the Health Department any time to pick up a COVID vaccine consent form and bring the completed form to your appointment. Forms are available in marked containers outside the clinic entrance. White forms are for those consenting to a pediatric dose.
